PROFESSOR MOGENS ANDRESEN

Mogens Andresen trained in Denmark and Britain. He is a professor at the Royal Danish Academy of Music, where he is the head of the brass department, a teacher of the bass trombone and the leader of the Academy's brass ensemble, DKDM-Brass.

Over the course of his career, Mogens Andresen has worked as a bass trombonist in several orchestras, including the Royal Danish Orchestra. He is co-founder of the Royal Danish Brass, and has performed regularly on bass sackbut in the Danish Violon-Bande ensemble. Many of his compositions and arrangements for brass have been used worldwide. He has made many recordings and performed at recitals in both Europe and the USA, and has also conducted brass ensembles at a number of music academies.

THE BRASS DEPARTMENT

The teaching staff of the brass department is composed of internationally-renowned teachers, and the department's many international students provide the foundation for a very diverse and inspirational study environment, with modern rehearsal and concert facilities.

The core ensemble of the brass department is DKDM-Brass, which plays a very comprehensive repertoire, and performs at both school concerts and more specialized concerts based on premiere performances of contemporary music. The big band performs both standards and their own, more specialized, arrangements.

THE ROYAL DANISH ACADEMY OF MUSIC, COPENHAGEN

The Royal Danish Academy of Music (DKDM) is located in newly-renovated buildings in the heart of Copenhagen.

DKDM is Denmark's oldest and largest music academy specializing in classical music. DKDM offers a three-year bachelor programme, a two-year master's programme, and advanced postgraduate diploma programmes lasting from two to four years. All of the study programmes are designed to match the demands of a modern labour market for musicians and music teachers. The majority of the courses are aimed at performance at the highest level.

The Academy ascribes great importance to co-operation with the professional international music world, and students are trained by a large staff with the best professors and teachers from Denmark and abroad.
